# 1. Pet Fleas, Alpaca Mites, Horse & Dog Mites, Head Lice

2008 has been a stinker of a year...so Vets & you are telling us. Also, we're hearing of increasing reactions & concerns about the chemical-based pet flea products. *Ruggle-it (formally Stop-it-All)* oil & shampoo & diluted mix have again proven highly successful against helping stop these 'residents' from remaining on ourselves & animals whilst doing so gently. Whilst the large animals are usually pretty easy to help (we have our Mites planner which ensures you go after the breeding zones as well as where the critters are biting), for pet-critters the shampoo is the key element & it's so easy to use!



• Quite a few of us with long & short-coated pets have not used any flea applications this year (no collars, drops or powders).... thus far we've not needed anything more than an infrequent shampoo & in some cases, a dab of oil between the shoulder blades, around the inside of normal collars (if they wear them) & where the tail joins the body.

• Wash bedding in our shampoo (a couple of tablespoons in your machine/bowl)...you can even add in an extra ½ teaspoon of oil into the mix for extra 'wallop'....this helps make the bedding 'really critter unfriendly' but it still smells nice for us & our pets & won't cause problems with their skin unlike some washing powders. For outside-living pets, you can spray the bedding with the diluted mix once every few weeks.

• For head lice it's really the oil with shampoo that works best....we have an information sheet which we can e-mail you if you'd like to get rid of them in a couple of quite steps!

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# 3. Probiotics Updated. a. An all-round Hero? | b. Professor Nicol's Foal research.

With **70%** of an animal's & **80%** of a human's immune system <u>depending</u> on a healthy intestine, the balance of good/bad bacteria in the gut is of paramount importance. Be it an alpaca, a horse, goat, foal, baby, dog, cat, bird or an OAP to name a few, probiotics can play a very vital role. Global research continues to show even more issues for which supporting the immune system's response via the gut is proving highly beneficial & very exciting. If the immune system response is over-active when say bitten by



bugs or under-active during a fungal or bacterial attack, the 'engine' of your animal is effectively **retarded**. Then you & your Vets can end up supporting animals that can no longer help themselves... With a high percentage of today's probiotic products using **unlicensed** probiotic strains, or containing **low CFU's** (say only one hundred million for humans & a few billion for animals), or having **low survivability** when passing through the digestive system as well as **unnecessary 'fillers'** such as wheat/oat feed, it's hard to know what products to trust. *Protexin* have been recommended & used by **Vets & Doctors** for years....and we've used them since the mid 1990s long before probiotics became 'fashionable'.

## When to use it (humans/animals):

• to support the digestive/immune system against muscle spasms & feeding-related equine feet issues • for recurring illness/health challenges • to help calm the immune system when suffering from itching • stress (from competition, travel (events/stud), weaning, health or bug -elated issues, work, unidentified skin/digestive issues) • when fed cereal, molasses & high-starch diets • for elderly humans & animals • for those susceptible to tummy upsets/fragility • after antibiotics & worming.

**Professor Christine Nicol MA Dphil of Bristol Veterinary School**, Thoroughbred Racing & Breeding Seminar, Cheltenham Racecourse (11/2008). The role of Stress & Starch on Foals (extract).

Professor Nicol discussed replacing foals' starch & sugar diets with fat & fibre for calmer behaviour & less stress especially at weaning. She identified the substantial body of research implicating diet/feeding in the development of **abnormal oral behaviour**. Surveys show that 4-5% of adult competition type horses show stereotypic behaviour patterns such as 'gulping air/grabbing doors/fences'. Evidence points towards diet as a major risk factor – 'gulping air' rates rise immediately after feeding, peaking c4-8 hours after a meal. Feeding low forage, high-grain diets increase the risks; feeding grain-based feeds to foals immediately after weaning increased the risks four-fold! Why? Professor Nicol believes that 'gulping air' may be an attempt to reduce excessive stomach acid which when on pasture, is naturally buffered thanks to continuous saliva but when the majority intake is from concentrated grain-based feeds, foregut irritations can arise. More research is required, however foals with 'oral behaviour' showed significantly greater stomach inflammation & early lesions than normal foals; feeding antacids tends to reduce oral behaviour; it is plausible that supplements (probiotics) may improve digestive comfort & thus changes similar to feeding a fat/fibre diet.

Horses, Alpacas – Simple Systems Feeds – click HERE. The scientists behind this company have long questioned why we continue to feed cereals, molasses, chemical preservatives, etc. when there is ample research showing it is very far from ideal for horses be it for severe gastric, behavioural or immune-related issues..... Sometimes sticking to old & profitable methods is easy; change can be inconvenient & sometimes less profitable.... With 91% of racehorses having ulcers [MURRAY ET AL, 1996] I wonder why it is only in the last 2 years that is has become common knowledge...yet back in the mid 1990s, we were shouting that we had to change the feeds & we were laughed at as 'typical weird alternative types'..... Cannon fodder we surely were back then...but time has proven us right.

**Donkeys** – recently Dr Faith Burden conducted research at the Donkey Sanctuary UK which showed 41% of the 426 donkeys tested, had ulcers & that the composition of the diet had an effect on ulceration. 55% of donkeys fed with carbohydrate cereal-based concentrates had gastric ulceration compared to 33% in the fibre-only group. ## 6. Useful Tips: a. Bio Security | b. Diluted Oil in cold weather | c. Mud & Mites Planner

**A.** Bio Security. If you need to wash your hands regularly to reduce the likelihood of transferring bugs & things, hands become dry. If you use our *Stop-it-All* shampoo as a liquid soap, you benefit from the anti-bacterial/fungal elements but also the moisturising properties. Or keep some of our soap at the tap (you cut them in half as they're so big!). Win Win....tough on bugs, kind on skin!

B. Now that it's cold, if you need to apply the diluted mix it's often easier to use

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when put into an old Tupperware box, old animal herbs swing-bucket or similar (must have a lid so that you can still shake it). If it becomes cold & rather 'gloopy' & would never get through the spray bottle nozzle, by being in the wide container you can dunk the body brush, paint brush, rag, sponge, cotton-wool ball or your hand into it & use it very effectively, lumps & all!
